FACING NEWARK

Facing Newark is new to the Open Doors Tour, showing in temporary exhibition space set aside specifically for large-scale installation artworks in 22,500 sq. ft. of prime commercial property on the 17th floor of One Washington Park, Newark.

Facing Newark represents a cultural and artistic collaboration between 30 artists from Newark and Lower Manhattan and Brooklyn, New York. This partnership not only establishes Newark as an alternative venue to the higher priced spaces in New York, it is displaying the artistic oeuvre of the growing volume and breadth of talent that is flourishing in the City. The show also helps to cement Newark's growing presence as a venue for seeing new trends in contemporary art.

The spectacular views and unprecedented amount of exhibit space for the Facing Newark installation presents artists with unusual opportunity to maximize their work visually and conceptually, combining movable functions and sound, mixed media and sculpture. The opening reception for Facing Newark also commemorates the closing of Newark's Open Artists' Studios & Available Space Tour 2005. Facing Newark runs through Sunday, November 13, 2005.

The Facing Newark exhibition is free and open to the public.

CHAKAIA BOOKER RETURNS TO CURATE

Internationally celebrated sculptor and Newark native Chakaia Booker is curator and juror for the 744 Redux Exhibition that is on view until Sunday, November 13, 2005. Twenty-six artists were chosen by Ms. Booker to exhibit their work at this exhibition. All events are free and open to the public. Ms. Booker was curator for the 2004 tour and graciously agreed to return this year in that same capacity. She continues to receive acclaim for her distinctive style of work and was named a John Simon Guggenheim Fellow for Sculpture in 2005. Guggenheim Fellows are appointed on the basis of distinguished achievement in the past and exceptional promise for future accomplishment.

In a reprise of last year's successful *Mix in the Bricks* exhibition at 744 Broad Street, artists from Newark and the surrounding metropolitan area will be included in a juried exhibition curated by Chakaia. The show originates from a concern by local artists that they are not significantly recognized for the work produced in their hometown and for the growth of a sophisticated cadre of artists now working in Newark whose work is on par with art being created across the region and the country. In 2004, The NAC commissioned Ms. Booker to work with these artists, and the Newark Artists Collective, to create a show that specifically addressed the influences unique to this urban experience. Like Ms. Booker, a native Newarker, many of the artists worked with found materials or addressed themes of urban life.

NAC Executive Director Linwood Oglesby indicated that he decided to again ask Ms. Booker to curate the show because it became clear through last year's experience that we had not fully mined the wealth suggested by its theme and of artistic talents bountiful in this community. Hence, the title of this year's exhibit, *744 Redux*: "brought back; returned". We are certain that whether you are returning or visiting this space for the first time, you will be stimulated and inspired by the creativity of this eclectic group of artists.

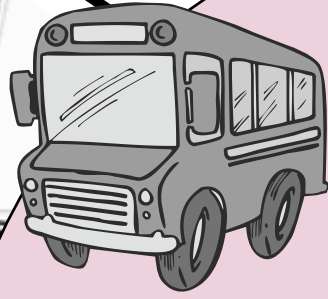
